Everything in the Old Testament points to Jesus, Romans 15:4. Let's study the cities of Refuge in ancient Israel and see how they remind us of the merciful Savior we have today.

I. The Need for Refuge

- A. An innocent man needed a place to be judged Deuteronomy 19:4-6, Deuteronomy 19:11-12
- B. Jesus is our place of refuge We are guilty of sin, Rom. 3:23, Luke 13:2-5 We are safe in Christ, Rom 6:4, 2 Cor. 5:21

II. The Name of Refuge, Joshua 20:7-8

III. The Nearness of Refuge

- A. Each city was placed in proximity, Num 13:13-15
- B. Jesus has given access to himself today
 He came to this world, John 1:14, 1 Tim 1:15
 He offers salvation to us, Eph 2:8-9, Mt 11:28-30
 We must accept him through obedience, Mark 16:16

IV. The Necessity of Urgency for Refuge

- A. If the slayer was not in the city, he could perish Num 35:26-28
- B. If we are not in Christ, we will perish In Christ (1 Thess 4:14-18) Out of Christ (2 Thess 1:6-9)
